Thank you for your interest in giving to Oakwood Church. The Bible teaches the importance of good stewardship in all of life, including our financial resources.

The three elements of giving that we stress come from 2 Corinthians 9:6-7.

They are:

- Generosity (2 Corinthians 9:6).
- Anonymity (2 Corinthians 9:7). Only those who record offerings will know what you give.
- Willingness. (2 Corinthians 9:7)

How Stewardship Works at Oakwood:

Step One: Prayerfully consider what the Lord wants you to give. Consider present and projected income and then follow the Holy Spirit's leading in determining an amount.

Step Two: Complete an anonymous commitment card determining what you will give on a weekly, bimonthly, or monthly basis. Mail it to us or return it to church to help our deacons plan our budget wisely.

Step Three: Determine what method you will use to give. You can give during the offering each Sunday, mail your check to the church, or sign up for automatic withdrawal using the form on the other side of this brochure.
