

Turning Points
Part Eight: David's House
1 and 2 Samuel; Exodus 40; Ezekiel 10 & 40; Luke 1
December 3, 2023

1. God's chosen people rejected His authority and asked for a king instead (1 Samuel 8:1-9)
2. Israel's first king, Saul, rebelled against God's authority.
 - He offered a sacrifice, something reserved for priests alone (1 Samuel 13:7-14a)
 - He ignored God's instructions regarding the Amalekites (15:1-23)
3. To replace Saul, God chose David as king.
 - He was an unlikely choice among his brothers (1 Samuel 16:6-13)
 - Before he was anointed by Samuel, God had already chosen him because he was a "man after his own heart" (1 Samuel 13:14b; 16:7)
4. God established an unconditional covenant with David (2 Samuel 7:8-16)
5. Because Israel broke the Mosaic covenant, God ended His protection over them and the monarchy.
 - God's glory entered the tent of meeting after Moses built it (Exodus 40:34-38)
 - The era of monarchy ended with God's glory departing from the temple (Ezekiel 10:18-19)
6. Jesus is the ultimate fulfillment of God's covenant with David (Luke 1:31-33)
 - Jesus is the one promised to Adam, Abraham and Moses (Genesis 3:15; 15:1-6; Deuteronomy 18:17-19)
 - One day God's glory will return and King Jesus will reign over all (Ezekiel 43:1-5)
