## Strong (Haggai) May 26, 2024

- 1. God's people had upside-down priorities (1:1-11)
  - They were complacent about their disobedience.
  - They spent a lot of time securing their own comfort.
  - Their disobedience resulted in God-sent frustration and failure.
- 2. They wisely heeded the rebuke from their God (1:12-15)
  - Leaders and people obeyed because they feared the Lord.
  - God promised his presence.
  - God energized their obedience.
- 3. God warned them not to let nostalgia about the past rob them of strength for the present (2:1-9)
  - The temple they were building was nothing compared with Solomon's temple.
  - God urged them to be strong because he was behind this 'inferior' work.
  - The temple they were building pointed to a future temple he would build that would eclipse all others with its glory.
- 4. God promised to bless them for their obedience (2:10-23)
  - He reminded them of how frustrated they were during their disobedience.
  - This new blessing was a direct consequence of their obedience.
  - This story highlights the importance of faithful leaders.
